The role of Landsvirkjun is to maximise return from the energy sources that have been entrusted to the company in a sustainable manner with efficiency and creation of value as the focus




Landsvirkjun

Division of electricity sales in 2011







Landsnet transmission system Customers








> **Opportunities:**

- Landowners contractual payments (or compensation for compulsory purchase)
- > Local authorities public taxes and contractual payments
- > Local communities spin-off benefits for local residents
- > State Treasury dividend, taxes and public levies
- > Public / Households prices
- > Financial institutions and companies- interest and capital taxes
- > Contracts with clients prices
- > Electricity utilities profits





Benefits for local authorities



> Public levies:


- > Property taxes on power-station buildings
- > Other possible payments:
 - > Property tax on other buildings
 - > Municipal income tax paid by employees
 - > Etc.
- No further taxation of power utilities in areas immediately influenced by power plants
- > The location of a power station may be of crucial importance to local authorities in the vicinity.

Benefits for local authorities



Infrastructure development

- Roads
- Telecommunications
- Overhead electricity lines; underground lines





Contractually specified payments. Example:

Funding of environmental projects, including:

- > Land reclamation
- > Forestry

Funding of community projects in the local government area

- > Collaboration on premises (Skriðuklaustur, Végarður, Þjórsárstofa)
- > Culturally related projects (exhibitions, archaeological excavations, etc.)
- > Tourism-related projects
- > School pupils' summer employment schemes

Operating phase benefits

- Local authorities in an area affected by a power station are not all in the same position regarding financial benefits
- Confusing or un-transparent arrangement could result in unfair division and arouse suspicion

Profitability benefits?

- An open discussion among stakeholders is needed
- The benefits for the local community must be clear
- Landsvirkjun welcomes collaboration with local authorities to create better rules for the benefit of the community.
- Parliament is best placed to set rules on the division of dividend, especially before substantial profitability benefits become evident
